EAUC Scotland Outcome Agreement with Scottish Funding Council April 2020 - March 2023



Accelerating action and leadership in Scotland's universities and colleges in order to respond to the climate emergency

Introduction:

EAUC Scotland's Mission is to inspire, empower and support leadership and collaborative action for sustainability across the Scottish further and higher education (FHE) sector. Our new programme Accelerating action and leadership in Scotland's universities and colleges in order to respond to the Climate Emergency will continue to support this mission, running from April 2020 to March 2023, and will build upon our previous outcome agreement work with the Scottish Funding Council, and on behalf of the Scottish further and higher institutions.

The Programme has five key Outcomes:

- 1) The sector is delivering dynamic and coordinated leadership and action in response to the climate emergency at all levels of Scottish further and higher education institutions
- 2) The further and higher education sector is able to provide the right data, skills, and knowledge to contribute towards national climate targets
- 3) Universities and colleges in Scotland are able to respond collectively at a sector-based, local and national level to the climate emergency and collaborate effectively within and beyond the sector.
- 4) Students develop the knowledge, skills, values and resilience required to lead and transform Scotland's future carbon-neutral, sustainable and inclusive economy.
- 5) EAUC Scotland's expertise and knowledge on sustainability within the FHE sector is accessed and utilized by wider stakeholders, including SFC

The Programme has eight key Performance Indicators (PIs):

- PI.1 There is an evidenced increase in transformative leadership activity across the sectors and across all communities
- PI.2 Structures are developed that enable better engagement and leadership across institutional communities, with output
- PI.3 Sector progress reports on PBCCD demonstrates continuing improvement in reporting quality and progress
- PI.4 New collaborative initiatives promote the place-based agenda supporting equal access to EAUC support at a regional/city level
- PI.5 Teaching and student communities are empowered to influence curriculums and learning experience, with output

This Programme will be delivered by EAUC, working in partnership with individual institutions and strategic partners in Scotland and beyond, to provide specific and targeted support for colleges and universities in Scotland for their response to the climate emergency. It will further strengthen the capabilities of both EAUC Scotland and individual FHE Institutions to intensify and progress activity on their environmental sustainability challenges, and in turn contribute towards the provision of longer term environmental, social, economic and educational benefits for individual FHE institutions, the Scottish Funding Council and as part of Scotland's national ambitions on the climate emergency.

Definitions:

Outcome: Effect of the Programme on individuals, institutions, or the sector as a whole, during the Programme's operation.

Impact: Lasting change in the sector as a result of the Programme.

Outcome Measure: Predetermined results towards which effort is directed, to be achieved by Programme end.

Milestone: Scheduled event that indicates the completion of a major deliverable of a project. Milestones are measurable and observable and serve as progress markers.

Deadlines: Programme runs April 2020 to March 2023 (Y1 – Y3) with four quarters ending June (Q1), September (Q3) and March (Q4) annually. All Milestones have deadline of a specific quarter.

EAUC-Scotland's response to Covid-19 and how we are supporting the sectors and our stakeholders:

In response to the COVID-19 outbreak, EAUC-Scotland has reviewed the planned actions within this Outcome Agreement to ensure we are providing the right support to members over the coming months. With support from our Office Bearers Group and the Scottish Funding Council, the Team will continue to support members through our sector helpline, facilitate virtual knowledge-sharing events where possible and focus further efforts on resource creation and its curation for members. Whilst our planned outcomes remain largely unchanged, we encourage any institution or college to contact us with requests for additional support as a result of Covid-19 and would encourage all members to use our sector helpline for this purpose.

New developments and milestone changes

To respond to the current challenges and opportunities, EAUC-Scotland will:

- produce monthly video and text sector briefings on sustainability concepts from April 2020 (Outcome 1 planned Y1 Q4)
- bring forward the development of a Students' Union / Association Engagement Strategy to Year 1 Q1 (Outcome 4 planned Y1 Q2)
- produce individual PBCCD Reports for the Scottish HE and FE sectors for 2018-19, in addition to the core delivery of a HFE sector report for the same period (Outcome 2 planned Y1 Q1)
- begin scoping the development of two new Topic Support Networks focussed on a) Health and Wellbeing; and, b) Student-led Sustainability
- compile a database of institutional strategic plans and sustainability strategies/carbon management plans to be shared with our contacts (new activity)

Mode of delivery

EAUC was an early adopter of, and advocate for, virtual networking to better support accessibility of knowledge as well as reducing environmental impacts of in-person travel. As a result, EAUC-Scotland has successfully adapted planned in-person events to become part of our virtual programme of events. One planned activity which required in-person attendance (to showcase on-site construction/energy innovations) has been postponed until government and institutional guidance will allow it. In addition to these changes, EAUC-UK has developed new engagement channels to provide more support for our members, including virtual "Wednesday Wins" which facilitates open discussion between members on a different topic each week. Whilst no in-person training events are currently scheduled to be delivered by EAUC-Scotland, we will be reviewing how we can offer institutions training virtually or through a blended approach following government and institutional guidance.
